

Who's involved

EPH is a community based collaboration between fourteen churches and The Salvation Army. EPH owns or leases family-sized housing units and EPH volunteers maintain and care for the homes. A Salvation Army case worker screens families that apply, places them in available EPH housing and assigns appropriate educational, counseling and mentorship programs.

The unique circumstances of each family dictate the duration spent in EPH housing, with the case worker continually monitoring the family's progress.

As faith calls us to minister with our neighbors in need, Ecumenical Partnership for Housing seeks, through partnership with religious congregations and social service agencies, to provide transitional housing and supporting services for homeless families with children.

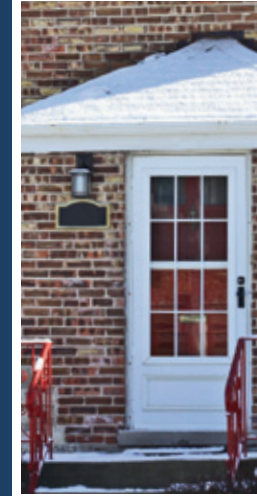
Our vision

What we do

The Ecumenical Partnership for Housing (EPH) is a comprehensive partnership between fourteen area churches and The Salvation Army that helps homeless families transition from a life of turmoil and dependency to a life of hope, security and self-sufficiency.

EPH doesn't just manage the problem of homelessness; we work to solve it. We introduce homeless families to a "new normal" by providing them with stable, secure transitional housing, case management, mentorship, education support and budget counseling. We offer them the tools they so desperately need to establish normalcy – a positive life path pointed directly toward personal and family stability.

Why Green Bay needs EPH

The Brown County United Way has identified homeless families as the number one need facing our area – an estimated 60% of the homeless in Green Bay are families with children. Few local facilities can accommodate the unique needs of sheltering families, so these very needy families remain underserved.
